Johnson was deployed overseas, but was able to participate in the award ceremony by an internet connection. The award was given by Bob Adams an ESGR Committee member on May 22nd at the Dayton Police Department in recognition of Chief Enga's support of his employee's service to the Army Reserve. Cpt Johnson was very appreciative of Chief Enga's support and assistance with his Army deployment and wanted to honor Chief Enga. The patriot award reflects the efforts made to support citizen warriors through a wide-range of measures including flexible schedules, time off prior to and after deployment, caring for families, and granting leaves of absence if needed. In addition to receiving a patriot award, Chief Enga signed an Employer Support Employment and Re-Employment

Rights Act. (USERRA) On behalf of the City of Dayton, Lieutenant Greg Burstad stated, "The Dayton Police Department has employed several current and former military members over the years. These officers brought many skills with them that they learned in their military training and careers. Military members and Veterans are extensively trained in ways that promote teamwork. In some cases, their survival depends on teamwork. No matter what branch they serve or have served in, teamwork is an integral part of training." ESGR is a Department of Defense office that develops and promotes supportive work environments for service members in the National Guard and Reserve through outreach, recognition and educational opportunities that increase awareness of applicable laws. ESGR also provides assistance in resolving conflicts between Service Members and their employers. ESGR celebrates over 51 years of excellence in support of the Reserve Components and their civilian employers.

National Night Out is an annual community-building campaign that promotes police-community partnerships to make our neighborhoods a safer, more caring place to live.


This years parties will be held on Tuesday, August 6th. We will guarantee that a Dayton Police

## **Rental Licenses Required**



Did you know owners need a Rental License to rent your home in Dayton? The owner of the property will need to complete a rental application online at the City website under the 'Resources' tab.

Once the application is approved, City staff will contact the owner

with further instructions on how to set up the rental inspection. The inspection is conducted to ensure that the property meets minimum building, housing and property maintenance standards. Once the inspection passes, the rental license certificate will be issued to the owner. Lastly, owners should contact Utility Billing to get an account set up.
