A message from the Police Chief

This time of year is a time of transition. Kids are back in school, temperatures will start to fall, and the leaves will start to change colors. It has been a very busy summer for the Police Department seeing a rise in calls for service and numerous events in the city. The Police Department strives to protect and serve the citizens of Dayton.

I want to remind everyone as the kids are back to school, school buses are now out on the roads transporting them to and from school. We will also see an increase in the use of crosswalks throughout the city. The Dayton Police Department responds to numerous complaints of vehicles not stopping for the School Bus Stop Arms or Crosswalks. The City has partnered with Safe Routes to School and added some modifications to the crosswalk area in front of Dayton Elementary. These modifications include adding flex posts, traffic tape and paint to make the crosswalk more visible to drivers.

Drivers should be aware of state law regarding Crosswalks (Minn §169.21) and School buses/stop arm violations (Minn §169.443). Violations of these statutes could result in charges up to a gross misdemeanor. Drivers should also remember that it is unlawful to pass a school bus on the right, and also unlawful to pass a vehicle that is stopped to let pedestrians cross.

As we move into fall, we are also moving into hunting season. The City of Dayton still allows hunting throughout the city and is regulated by both state law and city ordinance; please review the state laws and city ordinance on the city website at www.cityofdaytonmn.com and if you have any questions, please contact Police Department at 763-427-2017.

Results & Absentee Voting





Jack O' Lantern Pumpkin Trail: Pumpkin Pledge



and sediment build up. It also allows us to verify the operation of hydrants. We appreciate your partnership and want to share hydrant flushing tips:

- 1.) Avoid washing clothes during flushing
- 2.) Low pressure, discoloration, or cloudiness are possible. Run cold water until clear.
- 3.) If water pressure remains low, check faucet screens or water filters for trapped particles.
- 4.) Temporary discoloration affects appearance, it does not cause any health or safety risk.

Reduce Waste

Households in Minnesota are creating and throwing away more waste than ever. From junk mail to excess paint to food scraps - it takes a lot of time and money to deal with all of this garbage. Fortunately, there's a lot you can do to reduce your waste at home.

What can I do?

- Reduce excess paper at home. If you want to stop certain catalogs, you can contact mailers and ask them to remove your name from their mailing lists.
- Reduce the flow of junk mail will conserve natural resources, save landfill space and save you time and money.
- Reduce packaging waste. Packaging makes up 30 percent of municipal solid waste.
- Prevent food waste and compost organics. Food is wasted in many ways, such as preparing too much, letting fresh food go bad and buying too much.
- Use the least hazardous cleaning products. 4.4 million people, approxiametely 572 tons of liquid cleans and 132 tons of toilet bowl cleaners are washed down the drain each month!

- The best method to control pests inside the home is clean up crumbs and spills quickly. Pesticides are design to kill weeds, insects, rodents, mold & moths.

Riverview Villas

A proposed redevelopment of two residential lots into six townhome units, southwest corner of Levee Street and Dayton Avenue in the Historic Village. The project has gone through Concept Plan review and a zoning map amendment, Preliminary/Final Plat, and Site Plan approved.

Brayburn Trails East 1st and 2nd Addition

Approved the first two phases (109 lots) of a 139-unit residential development east of Brayburn Trails, south of 117th Avenue.

Sundance Greens 10th & 11th Addition


A continuation of the Sundance Greens neighborhood, the 10th and 11th Additions add 31 lots just south of Sundance Entertainment and 113th Avenue.

Riverwalk 3rd Addition

A part of the Riverwalk neighborhood, the 3rd Addition will add 25 lots south of Dayton River Road and West of River Hills Parkway.

Ordinance Update

Signs Prohibited in Right-of-Way



On December 12th, 2023, the City Council amended City Code 1001.20, Subd 6, prohibiting signs in the city right-of-way, and prohibiting off-premises signs in residential districts. The depth of right-of-way varies depending on the road. Generally, signs should be placed 15' or more behind the curb or edge of a road. A notice was emailed to area builders in January 2024.

On Monday, June 10th, the City began removing signs from the right-of-way. Signs will be stored at City Hall as space permits, or for a period of time, after which unclaimed signs will be discarded. Signs that have been removed by the City are stored at City Hall and can be picked up Monday - Thursday 7:30am - 5:00pm and Fridays 8:00am - noon. 


Kwik Trip

Approved Convenience Store and Truck Stop with fuel sales, located at the northeast corner of I-94 and Dayton Parkway.


Opus
