If a Dayton Police Officer is available, they will respond to some of the remaining registered parties in the City of Dayton. Only those parties chosen in the lottery will be guaranteed an officer and gift bags.

Pet Waste

There are over 300,000 dogs in Hennepin County. Pet waste contains bacteria that contributes to excessive algae growth, E. coli, and other water quality issues that are harmful to people, pets, fish, and other wildlife.

When it rains, feces left on your lawn can be washed into the nearest storm drain and carried to the nearby streams, lakes or rivers. Picking up pet waste, even in your own yard, keeps our local waters safe and clean for recreation, enjoyment and enhances the health of the environment.

City ordinances require pet owners to pick up dog waste. It is unlawful to leave your dog's feces on any public property including parks, streets and sidewalks, as well as private property that is not owned by the pet owner.

Development: Residential

Brayburn Trails East

Approved Phases 1 and 2 (109 lots) of a residential development east of Brayburn Trails, south of 117th Avenue North. The overall development will have a total of 132 single-family lots.

Riverview Villas

Redevelopment of two residential lots into six townhome units, southwest corner of Levee Street and Dayton Avenue in the Historic Village. The project was approved by the City Council in 2024 and is currently under construction.

Riverwalk

Located south of Dayton River Road and north of North Diamond Lake Road, the Riverwalk development recently received approvals for the 3rd and 4th phases. Riverwalk has added a total of 99 single-family lots within the last year, with one last phase of development anticipated to occur in the future.

Community Development: Commercial



The Cubes Industrial Building

The 1 million square foot building located off of County Road 81, Dayton Parkway and 117th Avenue North has a new tenant for half of the building. States Manufacturing out of Champlin, MN is expanding its operations to Dayton in 2025, and anticipates more than 300 jobs to come to the City with its presence.

Kwik Trip

Approved in 2024, Kwik Trip has recently begun the construction of a convenience store on the corner of Holly Lane North and Dayton Parkway. The anticipated completion date for the development is the end of September 2025.

Opus Industrial Development

Approved two-lot industrial development, northeast corner of Dayton Parkway and Territorial Road. The project includes an existing cell phone tower and a new 130,000 sq. ft. industrial building. TurbinePROs of Rogers, MN will be moving into 75,000 sq. ft. of the building upon completion, leaving 55,000 sq. ft. of space still available.

Dayton Creek Addition

Located on the south side of Dayton Parkway and I-94, the City Council approved a pre-liminary plat of mixed-use development, consisting of 11 buildable outlots that will be developed in the future.

Dayton Parkway Neighborhood

A multi-family and commercial/retail development, southwest corner of I-94 and Dayton Parkway. Phase 1 consists of a 180-unit apartment building. The project has gone through Concept Plan review and an Environmental Assessment Worksheet, Zoning Map Amendment, Planned Unit Development, Preliminary Plat and Site Plan review was approved by the City Council in November. Final Plat is currently pending review and decision.
