Planning & Park Commission Openings

If you have an interest in serving on either the Park Commission or Planning Commission there will be openings you can apply for on the City's website at www.cityofdaytonmn.com. Commission seats are 3 year terms beginning July 2022. Applications can be found under Employment on the website and will be accepted until June 06, 2022 at 5 pm.

Park Commission: The Parks Commission advises the City Council on matters regarding recreation, parks, trails and issues related to Dayton's environmental and natural resources. Activities include long range planning, review of new developments and recommendations for improvements. The Dayton Park Commission regularly meets on the first Tuesday of each month. Meetings begin at 6:30 p.m. and are held at Dayton City Hall.

Planning Commission: The Planning Commission advises the City Council on issues involving the establishment of and compliance with the Comprehensive Plan, the Zoning Ordinance, and the Subdivision Ordinances. The Commission reviews residential, commercial and industrial development proposals in order to ensure compliance with the City's goals and objectives set forth in the Comprehensive Plan, Zoning Ordinance, and Subdivision Ordinance. They then make a recommendation to the City Council on the proposal. The Dayton Planning Commission regularly meets on the First Thursday of each month. Meetings begin at 6:30 p.m. and are held at Dayton City Hall.

Overnight Parking Permits

Parking on streets in the City of Dayton is prohibited between the hours of 2 am - 6 am without a permit. Residents may obtain up to 3 permits, free of charge. If you plan on parking a vehicle(s) on the street overnight, you must obtain a parking permit from the Police Department. This is one way officers are able to determine if a vehicle belongs to someone in the area or not. You can access information on obtaining a parking permit in the Parking Permit and Vehicle page on the City website at www.cityofdaytonmn.com or stop by the Police Department (13700 Zanzibar Lane) with a proof of residency and fill out an application. Permits do not permit parking that is prohibited by any other City or County Ordinances, or MN State Statutes. Please note, PODS are to be parked in driveways or yards only. Water Conservation - The More You Sprinkle, The More You Pay!



Summer generates an increase in water usage which is primarily due to lawn irrigation. The majority of new homes have an automatic sprinkler system and these systems are set up initially through the builder to run frequently to establish newly installed sod. Once the turf is established, the irrigation system should be adjusted to water less frequently. To maintain a healthy lawn takes approximately 1 inch of water per week during the summer, which equates to resetting the irrigation system to run 3 times a week for 20 minutes.

Utility Billing:

The City of Dayton has a tiered water billing system, the more water you use, the more you are billed. Water used at the home is monitored by a meter that is installed where the water enters the home. Water entering the home is billable no matter what it is used for, so the water used for lawn maintenance is billed in the same way the water used for laundry or showering is billed. A home with an automatic sprinkler system and an average winter bill of \$86 may increase to \$228 a billing cycle during peak use due to an unadjusted sprinkler system.

Save Money:

Reducing residential water usage can save you money and help the City manage infrastructure costs so improvements do not have to be made prematurely. In addition to preserving water outside, there are ways to conserve water within the household. Some of these things are as simple as turning off the faucet while brushing teeth, taking showers instead of baths, and washing only full loads of laundry so no water is wasted. Household water leaks may also occur, so make sure those repairs are completed as soon as possible. The City recommends everyone views the University of Minnesota Extension & Metropolitan Council Irrigation Resources which aims to assist homeowners to have healthier lawns and efficient irrigation systems using less water. Organics Recycling

The City of Dayton is providing a organics container in a centralized location of Dayton to residents who would like to participate in organics recycling. Organics recycling involves collecting food scraps, non-recyclable paper and other compostable products to be recycled into compost at a large-scale composting facility. This process creates a nutrient-rich material that can be used in gardens and landscaping projects. Organics recycling is the best opportunity to reduce our trash - about 25% of what we throw away is organic materials. The City will send a form to fill out and return along with information about the program and how to receive controlled access to the dumpster.
