Emergency Outdoor Water Ban Information



The City has been working from its water supply plan to build infrastructure and identify locations and timings for wells based on current projected City growth. For several years, a well has been identified on the CIP for completion in 2021. The well is being constructed and should be online August 2021. The production well was drilled through the winter with test pumping completed March 2021. When production capacity was confirmed, all of the equipment and components were ordered for a 1200 gallons per minute well. The supply chain

is enduring considerable backlogs of equipment particularly electrical components, due to the COVID pandemic and factories didn't have production lines running at full capacity. This has caused the new wells to be delayed until August 2021.

The recent hot and dry drought conditions has resulted in a dramatic increase in water demand for irrigation purposes, which has caused the City to implement several changes to normal operating procedures. Staff increased the production values at Well 2 by 200 gallons per minute to maintain additional capacity. In May, the odd/even irrigation ordinance was implemented to try and manage flow volumes, that did not make a significant decrease in the volumes, so staff opened our Emergency connection to the City of Champlin's water service to supplement the Dayton supply. With Champlin experiencing the same water demand, they were unable to sustain the Dayton requirement. Staff closed the line and imposed an emergency irrigation ban which banned any water usage for irrigation purposes. Since then the City has been systematically easing restrictions so that residents can water once a week to maintain lawns.

The goal during this time is to allow residents to maintain lawns, trees, shrubs and gardens. Staff continuously monitors daily flow rates, once usage is at a level where we can meet fire flow demands and run the well at a sustainable level, restrictions will be loosened. Until further notice, irrigation is allowed one day per week for the most concentrated areas. Hand watering of trees, shrubs and plants is allowed. Please see area map on our City website for the irrigation days and times. If you are not in the areas listed within the development area map, you will be required to adhere to the existing odd/even irrigation ordinance. Developers and Builders have been asked the to refrain from installing new sod until August when our new well is expected to be online. To allow more frequent irrigation, cooperation from residents and observation of responsible irrigation practices is essential.
